ALL THINGS NEW (Part #5)

Request: I noticed that the Church Age is identified with the idea of "new." I first noticed it during the Eucharist when you referred to the "New Covenant". Could you do a study on this idea?

The following two passages of Scriptures came to mind with this request (2 Cor.5:17 and Rev.21:5).

"Therefore if (1cc) any man is in (en+loc of place) [positional truth] Christ, he is a new (kainos) creature; the old (archaios) things passed away (parerchomai / a.a.ind); behold, new (kainos) things have come (ginomai / perf.a.ind)." (2 Cor.5:17) "And he who sits on the throne said, 'Behold, I am making (poieo / p.a.ind) all things new (kainos)." (Rev.21:5)

There are two Greek words for NEW: kainos and neos.

- Kainos means new to form or quality and unused.
- **Neos** means new as recent or time.

This study will study SEVEN things that are NEW for the Church Age believer.

- 1. A New Covenant (Luke 22:20; 1 Cor.11:25; Heb.7:22; 8:8, 13; 9:1, 15; 12:24) neos (2 Cor.3:6).
- 2. A New Birth (John 3:3-8; Titus 3:5-7; 1 Pet.1:23; 2:2; 2 Pet.1:4; Eph.3:16).
- 3. A New Creature (2 Cor.5:16-21; Gal.6:15; Rev21:5).
- 4. A New Commandment (John 13:34-35; 15:17; Matt.19:19; 1 John 2:6-11).
- 5. **A New Life** (Rom.6:4; 7:5-6; 8:11).
- 6. **A New Man** (Eph.2:15; 4:22-32; Col.3:8-14) neos; 1 Cor.5:7) neos (Rom.12:2).
- 7. A New Heaven and Earth with everything NEW (2 Pet.3:13; Rev.21:1, 5) (Rev.2:17; 3:12; 21:2; Rev. 3:12; Rev.5:9; 21:2).
