## **GETTIN RID OF STUFF (#2)**

**Request**: "Could you explain in simple Bible terms the difference between old man behavior and old sin-nature behavior?"

Today's study developed out of a discussion from last week regarding the three categories of the sin derived from Adam's Original Sin (AOS) (imputation, inherent, and individual sin) (Gen.2:17).

It was during that discussion that we found ourselves engaged in a discussion involving the **role of "will power"** in controlling the problem of the lust gratification of our flesh (James 1:14-15).

- Lesson #1: Gettin Rid of Stuff of the old sin-nature.
- Lesson #2: Does will power play a role in controlling the old sin-nature?

(Rom.6:12) "Therefore do not let sin reign in mortal body that you should obey its lusts." (Rom.6:14) "For sin shall not be master over you."

Question: What doctrinal solution did God provide that worked supernaturally in CWL?

Answer: "But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desires of the flesh." (Gal.5:16)

• Some Bible students, attending the class, wanted to know how to justify a passage like "flee fornication" found in (1 Cor.6:18)?

## Therefore we have paused to address this question since it relates to the lesson subject

- 1. The Greek word flee is pheugo [to flee, run from]
  - Apopheugo (apo) (pheugo) is translated [to escape]. The following seven passages will be studied to answer the question regarding "fleeing".
  - Two questions must be asked with these seven passages Why? and How?
