THE DOCTRINE OF THE SIX STAGES OF GRACE (#3) Logistical Grace (#2)

We are currently studying the doctrine of the five stages of God's Grace in the Christ Way of Life (CWL).

- Saving Grace
- Logistical Grace
- Growth Maturity Grace
- Undeserved Suffering Grace
- Dying Grace
- Surpassing Grace.

These five stages of God's Grace cover the entire CWL from salvation to eternity in heaven (2 Cor.5:6-8).

Last week we studied two aspects of Logistical Grace.

This week we will study three additional aspects of Logistical Grace.

1. The word 'Logistic' is derived from the Greek word logos, logismos and **logizoma**i. Logos means 'word' or 'reason'. Therefore, 'logistic' refers to the art of calculating or reasoning.

We will examine three biblical concepts of logizomai.

- Logizomai can be used in **accounting** like totaling expenditures. It is translated 'numbered' or 'calculated' in (Lk.22:37) (Isa.53:12).
- It can be used for Cosmos Diabolicus reasoning that stands against the Word of God as part of the Angelic Conflict (AC)
 - (2 Cor.10:4-5) "For the <u>weapons of our warfare</u> are **not of the flesh, but divinely powerful** for the destruction of fortresses. We are destroying **speculations** (logismos) [logical reasoning of cosmos Diabolicus] and every lofty thing <u>raised up against the knowledge of God</u>, and we are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ." (1 Cor.1:18)
- It also can be used in **military science** to explain the procurement of supplies, maintenance and transportation of personnel associated with troop movement.
- 2. These are the concepts we will use in the Doctrine of Logistic Grace.

(Phil.4:19) "And my God shall supply (pleroo) (f.a.ind.3ps) [to fill full a deficiency] **all your needs** according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus."

How much is God willing to supply?

(Eph.3:20) "Now to Him who is <u>able to do</u> (dunamai) (p.m.ptc.dsm) <u>exceeding abundantly</u> (huperekperissos) <u>beyond</u> (huper+abl.of comparison) <u>all</u> that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us."

The context of (Phil.4:19) involves logistic support of Paul's missionary evangelism (Phil.4:11-19).

Listen to Paul's grace orientation and confidence:

(Phil.4:17) "Not that I seek the gift itself, but I seek for the profit which increases to your account." (2 Cor.9:10-15; Ex.3:21; 14:33-36; Heb.11:24-26)

3. Logistical Grace supplies and supports the Spiritually Advancing Belier in the Angelic Conflict to fulfill the Directive Will in the Plan of God (1 Cor.15:10; 1 Pet.5:7; Matt.6:25-34).

God's grace is always sufficient to meet every need in all five stages of growth in the CWL.

(2 Cor.12:9) "And He has said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness.' Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weakness, that the power of Christ may dwell in me." [Paul's thorn in the flesh]

The writer of Hebrews used the Exodus generation to illustrate this in (Heb.11:29-31)

(Ps.37:25-26) "I have been young and now I am old, yet I have not seen the righteous forsaken or His descendants begging bread. They are always generous and lend freely; their children will be blessed."

4. The Spiritually Advancing Believer becomes a partner in Logistical Grace with The Lord.

(2 Cor.9:8) "And <u>God is able</u> to make all grace abound to you, **so that** always having <u>all sufficiency in everything</u>, you may have an abundance **for** every good deed."

The NAS translation of (2 Cor.9:8) "God will supply the generous giver with enough to meet his own needs and enough to give for every good deed."

We will examine three examples of this principle.

- The feeding of the 5,000 is one example (John 6:1-15) [Philip, Andrew and the lad].
- The Macedonian and Corinthian churches make-up the second example (Phil.4:11-13, 17-19; 2 Cor.8:1, 13-15; 9:1-2, 6-14; 11:9).
- The widow of Zarephath who became a logistical grace partner with the Lord in Ejijah's ministry (1 Kings 17; Luke 4:25-26; James 5:17-18).
- Joseph became a logistical grace partner with the Lord to his family as well as to the nation of Egypt (Gen. 37:5-11; 50:24-26).
- 5. Logistical grace works to sustain the reversionist believer for spiritual recovery Prov.14:14).

God is faithful to His Word even when the Believer is unfaithful (2 Tim.2:13; Rom.3:3; 4:21).

We will give three examples of this principle:

• **Prodigal son** (Luke 15:14-20).

• Jonah (the book of Jonah).

• Exodus generation (1 Cor.10:1-6).

(1 Cor.10:6) "Now these things happened as examples to keep us from setting our hearts on evil things as they did." (Heb.3:12, 16)

(Deut.29:5) "During the 40 years that I led you through the desert, your clothes did not wear out, nor did the sandals on your feet."
