## THE DOCTRINE OF THE SIX STAGES OF GRACE (#5) Undeserved Suffering Grace (#1)

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Text: 2 Pet.3:17-18

We are currently studying the doctrine of the six stages of God's Grace in the Christ Way of Life (CWL).

- Saving Grace
- Logistical Grace
- Growth Maturity Grace
- Undeserved Suffering Grace
- Dying Grace
- Surpassing Grace.

Today's lesson will study the first three aspects of God's Grace called Undeserved Suffering (U/S).

1. Paul taught that Undeserved Suffering was a favored or special grace provision (charizomai) (a.p.ind.3ps) [granted] to every Church Age Believer (CAB).

(Phil.1:29-30) "For to you it has been granted for Christ's sake, **not only** to believe in Him, **but also** to suffer for His sake, experiencing the same conflict which you saw in me, and now hear to be in me." (1 Pet.2:21; 2 Cor.12:9)

The extent of ones Undeserved Suffering (U/S) depends upon the magnitude of the ministry God has assigned to it.

Job would be an example of this principle:

(James 5:11) "We count those <u>blessed who endured</u>. You have heard of the endurance of Job and have seen the outcome of the Lord's dealings, that the Lord is full of compassion and is merciful." (2 Cor.1:3-7)

2. It is important to distinguish between the three categories of suffering in the CWL:

(John 16:33) "These things I have spoken to you, so that in Me you may have peace. <u>In the world you have tribulation</u>, but take courage; **I have overcome the world**." (1 John 4:4; 5:4-4, 19).

We will give an example of each category of suffering in the CWL.

- Self-induced misery
  - **Eutychus** fell asleep during an all night bible study while sitting in a window, fell three stories, and died. Paul brought him back to life (Acts 20:7-12).
- Divine discipline
  - O **Jonah** was swallowed by a sea monster because he refused to obey the directive will of God (Jonah 1:1-2; 3:1-2)
    - § (Jonah 2:2) "I called out of my distress to the Lord, and He answered me. I cried for help from the depth of Sheol; You heard my voice." (Heb.5:5-11; Ps.119:67, 71)

## • Undeserved suffering

- o (Heb.11:24-26) "By faith **Moses**, when he had grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, <u>choosing rather to endure ill-treatment with the people of</u> God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, considering the <u>reproach of Christ greater riches</u> than the treasures of Egypt; for he was looking for the reward.
- 3. Undeserved suffering is designed to orient the ambassador for Christ in the world to trust the Lord with his life, even unto death (2 Cor.5:18-21).

(2 Tim.1:8-9) "Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony of our Lord or of me His prisoner, but join with me in **suffering for the gospel** according to the power of God, who has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to <u>His own purpose and grace which was granted us</u> in Christ Jesus from all eternity." (2 Cor.2:9-10) (Phil.1:7-8, 12-14; 20-21)

(2 Cor.1:8-10) "For we do not want you to be unaware, brethren, of **our affliction** which came to us in Asia, that we were <u>burdened excessively</u>, <u>beyond our strength</u>, so that we despaired even of life; indeed, we had the sentence of death within ourselves **so that we would not trust in ourselves**, **but in God** who raises the dead; who <u>delivered us</u> from so great a peril of death, and will <u>deliver us</u>, He on whom we have set our hope. And He will yet deliver us." (2 Cor.4:7-11; 11:23-30; 12:1-10)
