## 2013 Basic Doctrines (05)

(Predestination)

**Request**: "I am confused about predestination that teaches that some are predestined to hell without a choice. Could you explain the biblical teaching on predestination?"

The Greek word for predestination is proorizo (pro) [Beforehand] and (horizo) [To mark out or determine].

Therefore proorizo means to predetermine or predestine. Wuest Greek Word Study says it means "to fix a boundary beforehand" (Pg.102).

Predestination is looking at salvation from God's side of the redemptive history of Jesus Christ.

## We will study four aspects of the doctrine of Predestination.

1. Proorizo (predestination) is found in the following four key passages of Scriptures.

**NOTE:** Proorizo is <u>mentioned five times</u> with <u>five different church age doctrines</u> in these <u>four passages</u>.

(Acts 4:27-28) (vs.28)	The Plan of God (Acts 2:23-24)	
(Rom.8:28-30) (vs.29)	Conformed to image of Son of Go	d
(1 Cor.2:4-8) (vs.7)	Mystery wisdom of NC	
(Eph.1:3-14) (vs.5)	Adoption as Son of God (v	vs.11) Royal heir / Inheritance

Note that in each case, it is God who predestined.

2. The Bible is clear that believers are predestined to eternal life, but it never suggests that unbelievers are predestined to lake of fire (Eph.1:3-14; Rev.20:11-15).

All members of the human race are under judicial condemnation because of Adam's Original Sin (AOS) (John 3:16-18, 36; Rom.5:12-21).

The Church Age Believer (CAB) is no longer condemned because of personal faith in the gospel of grace salvation (Rom. 5:16-19; 8:1, 34-39; John 5:24) (1 Cor.15:3-4; Rom.1:16; Eph.2:8-9).

Condemnation becomes personalized when a person dies having rejected the gospel of grace salvation just like predestination becomes personalized by believing the gospel (John 3:16-18).

God decreed to predestine all who believe the gospel of grace salvation and to leave just condemnation to those who reject it (2 Pet.3:9; 1 Tim.2:4-6; **4:10**; Heb.2:9).

3. God decreed and predestined Jesus Christ to represent redemptive history (John 1:29; 1 Tim.1:15; Titus 2:11, 14; 1 Pet.1:18-19; 1 John 2:2; 4:9-10).

Predestination of the believer is the result of positive volition and faith in the gospel of grace salvation; while the unbeliever's eternal condemnation is the result of his / her negative volition and rejection of the gospel of grace salvation (John 3:16-18, 36; 20:31).

By being in union with Jesus Christ, the Church Age Believer (CAB) shares in His decreed and predestined redemptive history

(2 Cor.5:17-21; 2 Thess.2:13; Eph.1:4-6).

Every Church Age Believer (CAB) shares in the destiny of Jesus Christ which was predesigned in eternity past (Eph.1:4-6; John 14:1-3; 2 Cor.5:8).

"Predestination is limited to the elect people and assures their present position and future destiny." (Basic Theology by Ryrie, 361)

4. Predestination could be compared to an airplane on the run-way ready for departure with a predetermined destination. When you board that plane, you enter into that plane's predetermined destination (2 Cor.5:17; Eph.1:3-14/ note "in Him").

Omniscience is God's ability to know everything knowable or foreknown. God's foreknowledge is what God actually decreed as the Plan of God from the Eternal Life Conference (Eph.1:4; 1 cor.2:7).

Omniscience decreed foreknowledge and foreknowledge decreed predestination (Acts 2:23-24; Rom.8:28) There is no break in these four things (Rom.3:22-25).

The issue of predestination is not just between <u>man and God</u> but between <u>man</u>, **Jesus Christ** and God (John 14:6; 1 Tm.2:3-6; Heb.9:16; 12:24).

**Predestined:** "God has determined beforehand that those who believe in Christ will be adopted into His family and conformed to His Son (Rom.8:29). It involves a choice on His part (v.4); it is done in love (v.4); it is based on the good pleasure of His perfect will (vv.5, 9, 11); its purpose is to glorify God (v.14); but it does not relieve man of his responsibility to believe the gospel in order to bring to pass personally God's predestination (v.13)." (Ryrie Bible on Eph.1:15)

By being in union with Jesus Christ, the Church Age Believer (CAB) shares in the destiny of Jesus Christ that was predestined in eternity past (2 Cor.5:17; Eph.1:4-5; 1 Cor.12:13; Gal.3:27).
