2013 Basic Doctrines (07)

(Imputed Unrighteousness)

Imputed unrighteousness is a theological term associate with every unsaved member of the human race under Adam's Original Sin (AOS).

(Rom.3:9) "What then? Are we (Jews) better than they (Greeks)? Not at all, for we have already charged that both Jews and Greeks are all under sin (AOS)."

(Rom.3:10a) "As it is written, 'there is **none righteous**, **not even one.**" (Ps.14:1-3; 53:1-3)

This lesson will study four aspects of the doctrine of Imputed Unrighteousness status of all unsaved.

1. Paul taught the doctrine of imputed unrighteousness by four terms in our lesson text taken from two OT messianic passages.

"Nine times in four verses (vv.9-12) Paul mentioned the **universality of sin** (all) [2x], none or no one [4x], not even one [2x], and (together) [1x]." NIV Study Bible of (Rom.3:9)

2. The Greek word for unrighteous is adikia (-R).

Adikia refers to not being right or just in relationship with God based on the standard of the absolute righteousness (+R) of God.

(Ps.11:7) "For the **Lord is righteous**, He loves righteousness; The upright will behold His face."

Every member is born into the human race with the imputation of AOS unrighteousness (-R). It is the standard of the unsaved (Rom.3:9-12). This was true in OT as well as NT (2 Pet.2:5; Heb.11:7).

(Rom.1:18) "For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness."

(2 Cor.6:14) "Do not be bound together with unbelievers; for what **partnership** have righteousness and lawlessness, or what fellowship has light with darkness?"

3. Imputed unrighteousness is 1 of 13 judicial charges of AOS imputed to every member of the human race at physical birth (Rom.3:9-12).

(Rom.3:10) "There is none righteous, not even one." Why? "All under sin." (Rom.3:9b)

(Rom.3:22-23) "Even the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all those who believe; <u>for there is no distinction</u>; for **all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God**."

(Rom.5:12) "Therefore, just as **through one man** sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, **because all sinned**."

NOTE: This sin-barrier of AOS can only be removed by personal faith in the gospel of grace salvation (1 Cor.15:1-4; Rom.1:16; Eph.2:8-9).

4. The unrighteous often pursue a false standard of righteousness that is cosmos diabolicus (evil substitute for +R) (2 Cor.11:14-15; Acts 15:1, 5, 11; Rom.2:28-29).

We will look at two common substitutes for God's righteousness (+R): **moral** and **religious goodness**.

• <u>Moral conscience</u> of good can be a <u>positive virtue towards God</u> [at God-Consciousness] (Acts 10:35; Rom.3:20).

The unbeliever can be morally right as well as wrong (Matt.27:19; Luke 23:47; Matt.20:13). This does not send him to heaven or to hell (Rom.1:16-18).

• Religious conscience of good can also be a positive towards God [at God-Consciousness] (John 3:1-21; Acts 8:27-29, 35-38; 10:2, 30-31, 38-48; 16:14-15).

They both can also be a negative towards the gospel of grace salvation [at God-Consciousness] (Matt.19:16-22; Acts 26:27-29).

(Rom.3:10) "As it is written, 'there are none righteous, not even on."

(Gal.2:21) "I do not nullify the grace of God; **for if** righteousness comes through the Law, **then** Christ died needlessly."
