### Spiritual Life Dynamics (05) (The Sarkikos Man)

Last week, we learned that Paul used two different Greek suffices to identify two different sides to the sarx (Flesh) [our Old Sin Nature] (OSN).

- In (1 Cor.3:1), Paul used the suffix (inos) with sarx (sarkinos). This suffix emphasizes the material, source, origin of the OSN (**How we got it**).
- In (1 Cor.3:3), Paul used the Greek suffix (ikos) with sarx (sarkikos). This suffix emphasizes the characteristics produced by the OSN (**How it operates**).
- In (1 Cor.3:3), Paul used two explanatory conjunctions (gar) [for] to identify two self-evident divine truths regarding the sarkikos OSN.
  - 1<sup>st</sup> **"For you are still** (eti/temporal conjunction) <u>fleshly</u> (sarkikos)."
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> **"For since** (hopou / adverb) there is jealousy and strife among you."

Then Paul used a self-probing two part rhetorical question (expecting a YES response)

"Are (eimi / p.a.ind. 2pl) you **not** (**ouchi**) fleshly (sarkikos) **and** are you not walking (peripateo / p.a.ind. 2pl) like (kata+norm and standards) mere men (anthropos)."

Kata+ norm standards of the world – "And do not be conformed to the world." (Rom.12:2a)

### This lesson will study three aspects of how the OSN operates in the Sarkikos Man.

- 1. Paul has taught us that there are two divine principles and people that reflect living apart from God, the Holy Spirit in the church age.
  - Psuchikos Man lives apart as unbeliever because he does not have the indwelling of the Holy Spirit

(1 Cor.2:14; Jude 19; Rom.8:8-9). He receives the Indwelling Holy Spirit at the moment he believes the gospel of Jesus Christ (1 Cor.15:3-4; Rom.1:16; Gal.3:2-3).

• Sarkikos Man lives apart as a believer because he chose to live in lust gratification of the OSN

(Gal.5:16-17; Rom.7:23, 25a). He must confess his personal sin to be restored to fellowship with Indwelling Holy Spirit (1 John 1:7-9).

### 2. (James 1:14-15) explains the mechanics of how the OSN operates producing personal sin in the CWL.

- "Tempted."
- "Carried away and enticed by his own lust."
- "Lust conceived."
- "Gives birth to sin." (Heb.11:25; 2 Tim.3:4)
- "When sin is accomplished, it brings forth death (temporal) (1 Tm.5:6) (carnal state)."

How do we know when something is sin? (Rom.3:20; 7:7; 1 Cor.3:3; Gal.5:19-20).

Note what the three "let us" teach about our subject in (Rom.13:12-14).

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## **3.** The Church Age Believer (CAB) is never neutral regarding spirituality or carnality. He is either waking by the <u>indwelling Holy Spirit</u> (OR) the <u>Old Sin Nature</u> (OSN) (Gal.5:16-17).

**The key is human volition**. We chose to gratify the lust of the indwelling Holy Spirit or the lust of the OSN (Gal.5:17).

The word "Walk" in (Gal.5:16) is a **command** (peripateo / p.a.impv.).

### The indwelling Holy Spirit is the absolute supernatural power over the operation of the OSN.

### **BUT:**

- It requires obedience to the command to walk by Holy Spirit.
- It requires "not my will" but God's will be done" (Eph.6:6).
- It requires obedience to the **directive will of God**; rather than being carried away and enticed lust gratification.

(Rom.13:14b) "And make no provision for the flesh (OSN) in regard to its lust."

**Next Week**: When <u>human volition</u> links up with <u>Old Man Cosmos Diabolicus (OMCD) (Worldly) thinking</u> to a gratify a <u>lust trend</u> of the Old Sin Nature (OSN), it produces a carnal life style. In the world this is called addictive behavior.
