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THE CURSE OF THE LAW

While there are five verses in our lesson text, there are only three Greek sentences (Gal.3:10, 11-12, 13-14).

There are two important doctrines of Soteriology in:

- (Gal.3:11-2) Justification
- (Gal.3:13-14) Redemption

We will begin by examining our lesson text by four OT quotation contained in it.

(Gal.3:10)	(Deut.27:26)	Under the curse of the Law
(Gal.3:11)	(Habakkuk.2:4)	Justified by faith not by the Law (Rom.1:17; Heb.10:38)
(Gal.3:12)	(Lev.18:5)	Law is not of faith but doing
(Gal.3:13-14)	(Deut.21:22-23)	Redeemed from the curse of the Law to blessing of the Promise

This lesson will study four aspects of the Curse of Law

(Rom.4:25) "He was delivered over because of our transgressions, and was raised because of our justification."

- 1. There are five important notes to make from our lesson text at the beginning of our lesson.
 - Note that the word Law (nomos) is used in each verse except one ((Gal.3:14).
 - Note also that Paul associated a <u>negative effect</u> with the Law in each verse except one (Gal.3:14).
 - Note the factors of the curse of the Law mentioned in (Gal.3:10) and (Gal.3:13) written in Deuteronomy:

- 2. Paul declared that Jesus became a curse for us when He hung on the cross to redeem us from the curse of Law.

(Gal.3:13) "Christ redeemed (exagorazo/ a.a.ind.3ps) (Main Verb) (Redeemed us out of the slave market of sin) (Adam's Original Sin) (AOS) us from (ek+abl.of separation) the curse (katara) of the Law, having become (ginomai/ a.p.ptc. nsm) [The action of a orist tense occurs at the same time as the main verb) a curse for (huper+abl. of substitution) us – for it is written, 'cursed (epikataratos) is everyone who hangs (pas ho krenannumi/ p.m.ptc.nsm) on a tree.'" (Deut.21:22-23; Gal.4:5)

Hosea redeemed his wife from the salve market of prostitution for 30 pieces of silver (Hos.3:1-2)

(Gal.5:1) "<u>It was for freedom that Christ set us free</u>; therefore keep standing firm and **do not be subject again to a voke of slavery.**" (2 Tim.1:10)

How did everyone fall under the curse of the Law? _____ (1 Cor.15:22)

3. The curse of the Law existed before Abraham and before Moses. It goes back to Adam.

Before the fall, **Adam and Eve** had perfect conditions of body, soul, and spirit and lived in a perfect environment by the standard of the divine design (Gen.2).

While living in the Garden, God gave them the **Edenic Law (Gen.2:16-17).** It consisted of a positive decree (eating you shall eat - all trees, except ONE) and a negative decree (dying you shall die - the ONE tree) both decrees were established by absolute infinitives with finite verbs.

They are by grace and died by sin. (transgression) (Rom.4:15-16). By this sin, they lost the perfect conditions of life and environment for themselves **and mankind** (Gen.3:20-24; Rom.5:12-21; 8:18-23).

An important doctrinal point that we learn from Adam and Eve's transgression is that the Law was intended to be kept by believing and by doing (Gal.3:11-12). Don't eat (faith) became don't touch (flesh).

4. One of the thirteen judicial charges of Adam's original sin (AOS) is the Curse of Law (Gal.3:13-14).

Since every member of the human race is born under AOS, every member is under the curse of Law of sin and death (Rom.5:12-21; 1 Cor.15:22).

(Rom.8:2-3) "For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has <u>set you free from the law of sin and death</u>. For what the Law could not do, <u>weak as it was through the flesh</u>, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh." " (Rom.7:6; 10:4)

The standard of the Law condemns (Gal.3:10, 24; 5:3; James 2:10; 2 Cor.3:6, 17; Gal.3:14).

(Rom.3:9-10) "What then? Are we better than they? Not at all; for we have already charged that both Jews and Greeks are under sin; as it is written, 'There is none righteous, not even one." (Ps.14:1-3)

Christ took our curse of AOS to give us the promised blessing of indwelling Holy Spirit through Abraham seed (Gal.3:16) and (John 7:37-39; 16:7; 1 Cor.6:19-20).

(Gal.3:14) "In order that in Christ Jesus <u>the blessing of Abraham</u> **might come** (ginomai/ a.p.subj) to the Gentiles, so that (hina+subj) we **might receive** (lambano/ a.a.subj) <u>the promise of Spirit through</u> (dai+abl.of means) <u>faith</u>." (Gen.12:1-3)
