THE SCRIPTURAL GOSPEL (Part One)

Our 21st century vision here at DSBC is home and foreign missions. In this series we will make a distinction between a Christian <u>Ministry</u> and a Christian <u>Mission</u>.

- <u>Christian ministry</u> is a specifically assigned spiritual work either within the local church body or its community. An example here in DSBC could be our Sunday Ministry to our children, our nursery and that of our congregational praise team to our congregation.
- <u>Christian mission</u> involves several spiritual ministries working together towards common stated goals. Examples in DSBC could be our Ladies Bible Conference, our Summer Camps or our foreign Missions, i.e. the Morgans in the Philippine, the Sextons in Asia, the Williams in South America or the Broadheads assisting in India mission work.

Our School of Biblical Theology (SBT) is a training center for both ministry and mission work provided to all on a grace basis. It is designed to accomplish 2 Tim.3:16-17. "All Scripture is God breathed (inhale and exhale) and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work."

Beginning this Sunday, we will study the Theology for Mission from (1 Cor.15:1-58).

Today's two part lesson is entitled, The Scriptural Gospel, taken from (1 Cor.15:1-11).

- In the **first part** we will study a three point homiletic outline of our lesson text.
