GOD'S MERCY IN SALVATION (01)

Our lesson text consists of three Greek sentences: (1 Tim.1:12-14) Formerly a sinner; (1 Tim.1:15-16) Foremost of sinners and (1 Tim.1:17) Four-fold description of our Savior

Paul taught that **the Savior of (1 Tim.1:17)** was the source of God's Mercy being given to every Church Age Believer (CAB) on the basis of God's Grace. Note that Paul mentioned **God Mercy** as the <u>Key in Grace Salvation</u> to the former and foremost sinner (1 Tim.1:13, 16). What I found interesting was that Paul highlighted the doctrine of Mercy with his Grace Salvation.

Therefore this lesson will introduce the doctrine of God's Mercy in Salvation

The Greek verb (eleeo/ a.p.ind.1ps) was used two times with God's mercy in Paul's salvation. (1 Tim.1:13) and (1 Tim.1:16).

We will study four truths from parsing eleeo (a.p.ind.1ps).

• (a) The Aorist tense: A form of a verb that, in the indicative mood, expresses past action.

The moment Paul believed the gospel (in the past) there was immediately a "former life as a sinner".

(1 Tim.1:13) "<u>Even though I was</u> formerly a blasphemer and a persecutor and a violent aggressor. Yet I was shown mercy (eleeo/ a.p.ind.1ps) <u>because I acted ignorantly in unbelief</u>."

Paul was judicially guilty of Adam's Original Sin (AOS) and was in need of God's Mercy and not God's Justice. (Rom.5:12-21)

• (p) The Passive voice: Indicating that the grammatical subject of the verb (Paul) is the <u>recipient</u> (not the source) of the action denoted by the verb.

The moment he believed the gospel, he received Eternal Life by grace; Phil.4:21-22)

(1 Tim.1:16) "<u>Yet for this reason</u> **I found mercy (eleeo/ a.p.ind.1ps)**, so that **in me** as the **foremost** (1 Tim.**1:15b**), Jesus Christ might demonstrate His perfect patience <u>as an example for</u> those who would believe **in Him** for eternal life."

• (ind) The Indicative mood: Represents the act or state as an objective fact (Reality)

The moment he believed the gospel, **he received the reality of the gift** of salvation on the basis of God's grace through faith.

(Eph.2:8-9) "And the **grace of our Lord** was <u>more than abundant (huperpleonizo/ a.a.ind.3ps)</u> [Super-Grace] with the faith and love which are found in Christ Jesus." (1 Tim.1:14)

• (1ps) 1st Person Singular: Being only one; an individual; the one who believes.

God's grace salvation is **personal** to everyone who believes the gospel and not just Paul. (1 Cor.15:3-4; Rom.1:16; Eph.2:8-9; Phil.4:2-3) The Book of Life (**Luke 16:23-24**).
