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GOD'S MERCY TO BELIEVERS

We have been studying the doctrine of Mercy from chapter one (Heb.1:2, 13 and 16). We have just completed three lessons on God's Mercy in Salvation.

This lesson will study four aspects of God's mercy to the Spiritually Advancing Believer in the Church Age. (Heb.4:14-16)

- 1. When we examine Heb.4:14-16, we discover at least four doctrinal truths of how the high priesthood (archiereus) of Jesus Christ ministers mercy and grace to the spiritually advancing believer.
 - 1stJesus Christ is our Great High Priest (GHP) because He passed through the heavens (**Heb.4:14**; 7:24-28).
 - We are instructed to hold fast this as our great confession of faith.
 - 2nd Our Great High Priest can sympathize with our weaknesses(astheneia) (Matt.4:1-11; 16:21-23)
 - o Because He has been tempted in all aspects of the angelic conflict as we are, <u>yet without</u> sin (Heb.4:15).
 - 3rdEvery Church Age Believer (CAB) has access to the throne of grace of our Great High Priest (Heb.4:16a).
 - o Faith gives us confidence in this promise to approach our Great High Priest whether carnal or spiritual as a believer-priest (1 Pet.2:5, 9).
 - 4th As a believer-priest, we are promised by our Great High Priest to receive mercy and may find grace to help in time of need (4:16b).
- 2. The High Priesthood of Jesus Christ is after the order of Melchizedek and not Aaron (Heb.7).

The Great High Priesthood of JesusChrist is based on His resurrection, ascension, and session (Eph.1:20-22; Ps.110:1; Heb.1:3; 8:1).

(Heb.4:14) "Who has passed through (dierchomai/perf.m.ptc.asm) the heavens (tousouranos/aplm)?"

• (2 Cor.12:2) "Caught up to the third heaven."

• (2 Cor.12:4) "Caught up to Paradise."

• (1 Thess.4:17) "Caught up together with them in the cloud to meet the Lord in the air."

• (2 Cor.5:8) "We are of good courage, I say, and prefer rather to be absent from this body and to be at

home with the Lord."

After introducing the subject of the High Priesthood of Jesus Christ (Heb.4:14-16), the writer of Hebrews expanded the subject in Heb.5-10.

(Heb.9:24)"For Christ did not enter a holy place made with hands, a mere copy of the true one, but into heaven itself, **now to appear in the presence of God for us."**

3. During the church age, Jesus is Our Great High Priest over the church of believer-priests.

At the moment of grace salvation, <u>every CAB becomes a holy and royal priest</u> of Jesus Christ. It is 1 of 20 status privileges in the grace package of salvation (50 Things).

- (1 Pet.2:5) "You also, as living stones, are being built up as a spiritual house for a **holy priesthood**, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." (Rom.12:1-2)
- (1 Pet.2:9) "But you are a chosen race, a **royal priesthood**, a holy nation, a people of God's own possession, so that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light."
- (Rev.5:10) "You have made them to be a **kingdom of priests to our God**; and they will reign upon the earth." (Rev.1:6)

4. As a believer-priest in church age, you have access to the throne of the grace (to thronostescharis).

(Heb.4:16) "Let us therefore (oun/ inferential conj.) draw near (proserchomai/ p.a.subj. 1pl) with confidence to the throne of grace, that (hina+subj/ result of confidence) we may receive (lambano/ a.a.subj.1pl) mercy (eleos) and may find (heurisko/ a.a.subj.1pl) grace to help in time of need."

Note the **three hortatory subjunctives** (volition and perfect timing of sovereignty of God) in Heb.4:16.

- <u>Draw near</u> (proserchomai/ present/ continuous/p.a.subj.1pl) "with confidence" (parrhesia) [to bring Categorical Bible Doctrine (CBD) to application in prayer] (1 John 5:14-15)
- <u>May receive</u> (lambano/ aorist/ point in past time/a.a.subj.1pl) "Mercy" (received as result of self-evaluation of misery of weakness). Peter received it after 3 denials of Jesus (Matt.26:69-75; **Luke 18:9-14**).
- <u>May find</u> (heurisko/ aorist a.subj.1pl). "Grace (charis) [grace operating assets] (Phil.4:19) to help (eis+acc.boetheia) [help in God's perfect timing] in time of need (eukairos) [in that critical moment of need] (Gal.4:4)."
