## **HISTORY OF NATIONALISM**

Today's message is a reminder of the importance of nationalism. It is a reminder that nationalism is a Divine Institution concept for the post-diluvian civilization (after the Noahic flood), our civilization.

As post-diluvian Christians, we must understand that internationalism and globalization (one world governing) is evil (Tower of Babel) (Gen.11). A wonderful thing happened recently that gave me hope for Great Britain. They returned to nationalism. Pray that they not waiver in their decision.

This lesson will remind us of two basic truths associated with the History of Nationalism.

## 1. The origin of nations is given in the 3rd and 4th Toledoths of the second manuscript of the Book Genesis (Gen.6:9-11:9).

We are reminded that all nations came by boat to a new world (by way of the Ark of Noah). Noah's Ark took form during the antediluvian old world and delivered them into the post-diluvian new world. Mt Ararat became their Statue of Liberty (freedom).

On 2/27/601 [1st day, 1st month of Noah's age], they were welcomed as pilgrims seeking spiritual liberty by the Grace of God into a new land of opportunity. (Gen.8:13-16)

## 2. Seventy nations came from the three sons and descendants of Noah: Japheth, Ham, and Shem (Gen.10).

Gen.10 gives us the origin of all post-diluvian nations.

All post-diluvian nations have the same three national identifications: (Gen.10:5, 20, 31).

- land,
- language
- lineage

(Gen.10:31) "These are the sons of Shem, according to the families (lineage), according to their languages, by their lands, according to their nations."

I mentioned Shem because the Shemites carried the message of the gospel of Christ (Luke 3:35, 23).

Because of the influence of the Reformation and the English language upon the modern post-diluvian world, God used free enterprise commerce and Christian missionaries with the message of gospel of Christ to reach "the ends of the earth."
