### PREACH THE RESURRECTION, ASCENSION, AND SESSION OF JESUS CHRIST

In our last lesion, we introduced our outline of studies from (1 Cor.15:1-58)

### We will divide 1 Cor.15:1-58 into six sections of context for study.

(1 Cor.15:1-11)	Preach Gospel of Grace Salvation
(1 Cor.15:12-19)	Preach the Resurrection
(1 Cor.15:20-28)	Preach the Order of the Resurrection
(1 Cor.15:29-34)	Preach the Victory of Resurrection
(1 Cor.15:35-49)	Preach the Resurrection Body
(1 Cor.15:50-58)	Preach the Mystery of the Rapture

### We have divided (1 Cor.15:1-11) into two studies.

(1 Cor.15:1-4)	Preach the Gospel of Grace Salvation.
(1 Cor.15:5-11)	Preach the Resurrection, Ascension, and Session of Jesus Christ.

In last week's lesion, we studied Paul's use of a series of declarative conjunctives (hoti) [that] as three point Greek grammatical marker to describe the gospel of grace salvation (1 Cor.15:3-4).

- "That (hoti) Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures."
- "And that (hoti) He was buried."
- "And that (hoti) He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."

In this lesson, Paul opens with the final declarative conjunction (hoti) [that] in this series (1 Cor.15:3-5).

### (1 Cor.15:5) "And that He appeared (post-resurrection)."

Paul will once again use the Greek language as marker to emphasize the post-resurrection appearance of Jesus Christ prior to His ascension. (horao/ a.p.ind.3ms) [appeared].

We will study <u>five aspects</u> of the importance of Preaching the Resurrection, Ascension, and Session of Jesus Christ.

# 1. Paul used horao (a.p.ind.3ms) four times to outline the historical and legal witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

(1 Cor.15:5)	appearance to Cephas and the Twelve.
(1 Cor.15:6)	appearance to more than 500 CABs at one time.
(1 Cor.15:7)	appearance to James and all the Apostles.
(1 Cor.15:8-11)	appearance to Paul (post-ascension appearance) - Exception.

Most were still alive at the time of this writing.

(1 Cor.15:11) "Whether then it was I or they, so we preach (kerusso/ p.a.ind.1pl) and so you believe."

### 2. All the post-resurrection appearance of Jesus occurred over a period of 40 days.

They occurred between the First-fruit and Pentecost Jewish festivals (Lev.23:15-16)

- The day after the weekly Sabbath of Unleavened bread is First-fruits, now count 50 days and you have the festival of Pentecost. (John 20:1) First day of week/ Sunday/ empty tomb!
- At the end of the 40 days of post-resurrection appearances Jesus ascended back to His Father (Acts 1:1-3; 9-11).
- This left a 10-day interval before Pentecost (Acts 1:5; 2:1-4, 32, 36; John 7:38-39) for the Session of Jesus to take place (Acts 2:33-36; Eph.1:20-23).

## **3.** To better understand the period of 40 days of post-resurrection appearances, we have divided them into four sections of study.

**First section** involved two declarations of the empty tomb of Jesus Christ on **Resurrection Sunday** by angels and women.

•	Galilean women	(Luke 23:55-24:12; Mark 16:1-8)
٠	Peter and John	(Luke 24:8-10; John 20:1-10)

Second section introduced three post-resurrection appearance s of Jesus Christ on Resurrection Sunday.

•	Mary Magdalene	(Mark 16:9; John 20:11-18
٠	Cleopas and another disciple on the road to Emmaus	(Luke 24:13-35)
٠	Ten disciples of Jesus (minus Judas and Thomas)	(John 20:19-25)

Third section of post-resurrection appearances occurred 8 days later.

• ]	Eleven disciple of Jesus	(John 20:24-29)
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Fourth section contains the rest of the recorded post-resurrection appearances of this 40-day period.

٠	Seven disciples of Jesus on Sea of Tiberius	(John 21:1-25; 1 Cor.15:5).
٠	Eleven disciples of Jesus on a Mt. of Galilee	(Mark 16:7; Matt.28:16-20)
٠	500 disciples at one time	(1 Cor.15:6)
٠	James and all the Apostles	(1 Cor.15:7)
٠	Many disciples towards the end of the 40 days	(Luke 24:36-49; Acts 1:1-3)
٠	Disciples of Jesus on Mt. of Olives and His ascension	(Luke 24:50-52; Acts 1:4-13).

## 4. We are told that if all the messages of Jesus had been recorded in detail the world would not contain the books that would be written (John 21:24-25; 20:30).

**First section** message delivered by angels (Luke 24:5-8).and Galilean women but not by Jesus (Luke 24:10-12).

Second section message delivered by Jesus to Mary (John 20:14-18); Cleopas (Luke 24:25-27); Ten disciples (John 20:19-23).

Third section message delivered by Jesus to Eleven disciples (John 20:26-29).

**Fourth section** message by Jesus to Seven disciples (John 21:15-25); Eleven disciples on a Mt. in Galilee (Matt.28:16-20); no message mentioned with 500 or James; many disciples towards the end of 40 days (Luke 24:36-49); and finally, Disciples on Mt. of Olives (Acts 1:4-8).

His ascension is declared by two angels delivering their final message on it (Acts 1:9-12).
