THE DIVINE INSTITUTION OF EMPLOYMENT

We are currently studying James' warning in area of Divine Institution #2, Employment. James warns Employers of abuse of laws of Divine Establish of Employment (Jas.5:4).

The proof text for James would be the Five Cycles of Divine Discipline to the Priest-Nation of Israel for abuses in area of Divine Institution #2 (Lev.26:14-46). The second cycle of Divine Discipline upon Priest-Nation of Israel is economics of employment (Lev.26:18-21) (read).

(Lev.26:21) "If then you act with hostility against Me and are unwilling to obey Me, I will increase the plague (Divine Institution) on you seven times according to your sin."

In our lesson text, James addressed the sin against Divine Institution #2 that will bring Divine Discipline upon Israel. He describes how believers should respond before God sends Divine Discipline – "Weep and howl for the miseries which are coming to you." (Jas.5:1)

(Jas.5:4) "The withheld pay of the laborers (sin) cries out against you to the Lord of Sabaoth."

This lesson will study three aspects of Divine Institution of Employment.

1. God instituted Employment as Divine Institution #2 before the fall of Adam (Gen.2:8, 15-17).

God established five laws of divine establishment before the fall of Adam. Four of these laws of establishment remain. Only one was changed.

- 1st law established was the structure of employment:
 - o (Gen.2:8) Employer and employee
 - o God planted the Garden (employer) and put man into it (employee)
- 2nd law established was divine chain of command:
 - o (1 Cor.11:3) God to Lord to Employer to Employee (Col.3:22-4:1)
 - o (Gen.2:15) "Lord put the man in Garden and commanded him.")
- 3rd law established was job description for employee
 - o (Gen.2:15) "Cultivate and keep it."
 - o (Luke 13:14) and work six days a week
- 4th law established was the fruit of labor comes from God's grace.
 - o (Gen.2:16) "From any tree of the garden you may eat freely."
 - o (Matt.6:11; John 6:31-33)

- 5th law established was a prohibitive of garden employment
 - o (Gen.2:17) "But from the tree of knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat from it you will surely die."
 - o Cultivate and keep it up, but DON'T EAT from that one tree.

2. After the fall of Adam, the 5th law of establishment was moved from employment to theology (Rom.5:12-21).

The 5th law of establishment was **changed** because of divine discipline to "Cursed is the ground (the created source of employment) (Gen.3:17-19)."

The 5th divine law of establishment, "Curse of the Ground." has a five-fold effect upon employment.

- (Gen.3:17b) "In toil you will eat of it."
- (Gen.3:17c) "All the days of your life."
- (Gen.3:18a) "Both thorns and thistles it shall grow for you and you will eat the plants of the field."
- (Gen.3:19a) "By sweat of your face you will eat bread."
- (Gen.3:19b) "Till you return to the ground, because from it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

3. DI #2, Employment, was established by God to occupy time, energy, and intelligence for a self-productive life on earth.

There is "A time to plant and a time to uproot what is planted." (Eccl.3:2)

Question: "What profit is there to the worker from that which he toils?" (Eccl.3:9)

Question: "For what does a man get in all his labor and in his striving with which he labors under the sun? Because all his days is task is painful and grievous; even at night his mind does not rest. This too is vanity. There is **nothing better** for a man than to <u>eat and drink and tell himself</u> that his **labor is good.** This also I have seen that is **from the hand of God.**" (Eccl.2:22-24) (Eccl.1:3; 2:11; 3:9-13; 5:16-20)
