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### **BECOME IMITATORS OF THE LORD**

(1 Thess.1-10) could be examined by the following three sections.

•	1 Thess.1:1-5	"we section"	From the Pauline missionary team.
•	1 Thess.1:6-8	"You section"	To the Church of Thessalonians
•	1 Thess.1:9-10	"They section"	About Believers in Macedonia-Achaia

In our <u>last study</u> we were introduced to the Greek word, ginomai, (1 Thess.1:5). We learned that ginomai is normally translated in English "become" and refers to "changed conditions."

In 1 Thess.1:5, Paul used ginomai to define the resulting <u>changed condition</u> that the gospel of grace salvation brings to the soul of the person who believes the gospel (1 Cor.15:3-4; Rom.1:16; Eph.2:8-9; 1 Thess.1:5) **Both "in word, power, Holy Spirit, and full conviction"** 

In this lesson our text gives us two more uses of the verb ginomai (became). Both are directed towards changed conditions in the Christian way of life.

- 1 Thess.1:6 "You also became (a.m.ind.2pl)
- 1 Thess.1:7 "So that **you** <u>became</u> (aorist infin)\_\_\_\_\_\_"

# This lesson will study <u>four characteristics</u> of believers. BECOMING IMITATORS OF LORD.

1. Paul declared in (1 Thess.1:6) that the newly formed bodies of those recently saved became imitators of the Lord in Thessalonica.

The Greek word **for imitator** is mimetes (nplm/ predicate nominative). It is used to emphatically define the subject along with verb of **becoming imitators of the Lord** (1 Thess.1:6; 2:14)

## (1 Thess.1:6) "You also, (vs.5):

- after believing the gospel of grace salvation YOU became (ginomai (aorist m.ind.2pl)
- imitators of us and of the Lord, having received (dechomai/a.m.ptc nplm) the word.
  - Milk (Basic Categorical Bible Doctrines)
- in much tribulation (Acts 17:1-11, 13; 2 Cor.7:5)
  - Missionary evangelism
- with the joy of the Holy Spirit (Gal.5:16, 22-23/ Rom.5:5)."
  - The joy that comes from the Indwelling Holy Spirit.

Every time the term imitator is used as a noun (mimetes), it is used with verb (ginomai) (1 Cor.4:16; 11:1; Eph.5:1; Phil.3:17) [always in the p.m.impv.2pl].

2. Thessalonian believers Became Imitators of the Lord by taking responsibility for securing their faith in God's amazing grace salvation.

(1 Pet.2:2) "Like newborn babies (brephos), long for (epipodeo/ a.m.ind.2pl) the <u>pure milk of the word</u>, so that by it you may grow in respect to salvation." (soteria) [soteriology]

Remember (ginomai) refers to a changed condition in the soul of a newly saved person which creates a "longing for the pure (mother's) **milk of the word of God**." It's a natural desire to <u>inhale and exhale</u> the breath of spiritual life (2 Tim.3:6-17; Eph.2:5; Rom.8:9-11).

Mild doctrines provide assurance, as new-born baby believer, of your grace salvation.

### Here is an example of Seven Milk Doctrines for baby believer:

- Essence of God and how it functions in members of Godhead.
- How the Gospel saves, the mechanics of Grace Salvation
- Evangelism, being the ministry of God, the Holy Spirit
- The four sections of the 50 Things every church age believer receives,
  - o That can never be lost in time or eternity.
- Positional Sanctification
- Eternal life
- The six stages of Grace
- 3. They became Imitators of the Lord as a result of the progression of their spiritual growth.

There are two spiritual diets for three groups of believers: (Heb.5:11-14; Eph.5:1-2)

- Milk doctrines are for baby believers and reversion believers.
- Meat doctrines for spiritually <u>advancing maturing believers</u>.

Heb.5:11 refers to spiritually "backsliding" believers who have become (ginomai) dull of hearing.

• **Backslide**r was used in (Prov.14:14) (sug) [the carnal believer]. **Jeremiah** used a different Hebrew word (meshubah) [reversion or spiritual apostasy] (Jer. 2:19; 3:6-8, 11-14; 5:6; 8:5-6; 14:7).

**Heb.5:12** explains why reversionistic believers are in need of a refresher course in milk doctrines. **Heb.5:13** explains who naturally needs the milk doctrines of salvation in their spiritual life.

4. The Thessalonians became Imitators of the Lord (and Paul) by reaching and maintaining spiritual maturity in the Christian Way of Life by devouring MEAT doctrines (Phil.3:17-18) (summimetes).

(Heb.5:14) "But solid food (**meat**) is **for the mature** (teleios) <u>https://teleiology.com/</u> who because of practice have their senses trained to discern good and evil."

# **Meat doctrines for the Christian Way of Life (15 starters):**

- Carnality verses Spirituality
- Confession of sin for experiential sanctification
- Walking by means of the Indwelling Holy Spirit
- The Faith Cycle
- Spiritual warfare and the Full Armor of God
- The different categories of suffering
- Classifications of the Will of God
- Maintaining an effective prayer life
- Spiritual gifted ministry in the body of Christ, the Church
- Missionary foreign and home ministries
- The Judgment Seat of Christ, rewards, and crowns
- Dying Grace
- Dispensations
- Eschatology (the Rapture/ order of the resurrection)

(Heb.13:7) "Remember those who led you, who spoke the word of God to you, and considering the result of their conduct, **imitate** (mimeomai/p.m.infin) **their faith.**"
